Using iPads in AAC

There has been great interest recently in the potential of the iPad / iPod as tools for communication, and the creation of over 200 apps specifically to support communication.

The iPad is a mainstream device leading to economies of scale in production and is therefore more affordable than many communication aids. It is attractive to users as it has the 'cool' factor and does not mark them out as 'different'. On the other hand, there are definitely access issues for some users and even the best communication apps do not have all of the features available in advanced communication aids. Many ambitious claims are made for the value of the iPad, especially for autistic users - but do we know how realistic these claims are?

The Study Day will provide case studies illustrating the use of iPads for communication by children and adults from different parts of Scotland. There will also be opportunities to find out more about the wide range of communication apps and accessories available for the iPad and other devices.

A number of the UK's leading commercial developers / suppliers of apps with a focus on communication will exhibit and demonstrate their latest products.

Augmentative Communication in Practice: Scotland

This is the 22nd annual event organised by Augmentative Communication in Practice: Scotland (ACiP:S). Study Day events focus on a particular aspect of Augmentative and Alternative Communication, sometimes with a single well-known speaker, or often as Workshop days. We also organise events for/ with people who use AAC.

The Organising Committee consists of staff from the main centres and services in Scotland with a particular interest in Augmentative and Alternative Communication - Ayrshire and Arran AAC Resource, CALL Scotland, FACCT, KEYCOMM, SCTCI and TASSCC.
