Dual Language Speakers

Keycomm have been looking into the existing communication apps to identify whether AAC users who need to switch languages can do so easily. For some of the communication apps, you would need to purchase an additional copy of the app for each language. This can be costly.



Proloquo4text, a text to speech app developed by Assistiveware, does support many languages used within one app. It is easy to switch keyboards and speech output

at the touch of a button. This requires users to first load up the different language keyboards within the Ipad keyboard settings. Then when using the app there is a world icon on the keyboard. When pressed this allows each user to change the keyboard to a different language which in this app automatically changes the voice output. (The speech output will only work if there is a corresponding synthetic voice available). This allows an individual user to converse using 2 languages and to switch easily between the 2 languages. This may be applicable when an individual speaks one language with family and friends and another language with professionals. Beware- this is not a translation app! It will not translate text or speech into different languages.

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Scottish Government News

There is a now a 2 year project at the Scottish Government focussing on developing AAC across Scotland. They have appointed a new AAC team which consists of a new AAC Improvement Officer, Jean Alexander. This team will be taking many issues forward including developing directions to NHS Boards on implementing the new legislation.

They have also revised the AAC Advisory Group which will meet for the first time in December. Members of the advisory group consist of various stakeholders including AHP's working within AAC and the third sector.

Refresh your memory on Photo Story Apps

The use of photos for communication has had a massive growth within the last few years. This is because it is much easier to take the photos and use them right away via the Ipad/Android devices. Here is a list of various photo story apps for the Ipad you might find useful. All the apps below can be purchased through I tunes.



1. **Pictello**- This app allows you to take photos and put them together in individual stories with both text and audio recording for each page. It is easy to use and is available through the app store for £14.99. It is also available for Android devices.

2. **Our Story**- This is a photo story app developed by the Open University. It has been designed to add sound and text to your digital photos to make a story. It is a bit more difficult to programme however it does provide in app instructions through a Get Started button. Free



3. **Talking Pictures**- This is a simple, easy to use app that allows you to put speech output on different parts of a photo. It is easy to use but does not link the photos up to create a story. Free for the basic version.

4. **Snap Scene**- This is a new app developed by Tobii Dynavox. This app is similar to Talking pictures as it allows you to record speech output onto different hotspots on your photos. The difference is that it stores your photos in folders which can be easier to manage when you build up quite a big library. It is quite straightforward to use as there are 2 modes: create mode and play mode.
